It is ten years this Autumn since about 15 organisations concerned about the rising tide of alcohol-related harm came together as the UK Alcohol Health Alliance. Professor Ian Gilmore will outline some of the successes and failures of trying to get evidence-based policies introduced, using examples relevant to all countries facing similar challenges.

Professor Sir Ian Gilmore is an honorary consultant physician at the Royal Liverpool University Hospital and holds an honorary chair at the University of Liverpool and an adjunct chair at the National Drug Research Institute, Curtin University. After training in Cambridge, London and the USA, he moved to Liverpool as a consultant in 1980. He is past-president of the Royal College of Physicians (RCP) and the British Society of Gastroenterology, and currently chairs Liverpool Health Partners, created to promote an Academic Health Science System. He chairs the UK Alcohol Health Alliance and the Department of Health Prescribed Specialised Services Advisory Group. He is a member of the Climate and Health Council.
